## **MESSAGE FROM** TREASA MCAULIFFE, **CHIEF EXECUTIVE**



Treasa McAuliffe is the new CEO of St. Gabriel's Foundation. She took up the role in December.

There have been some changes in the organisation in the last few months. In December last year, I was appointed as Chief Executive. I am delighted and honoured to have been trusted with the role of bringing the Foundation into a period where there is a huge focus on improving access to services for families nationally.

I would like to thank my predecessor Máire O'Leary, who gave over 30 years of service to the role and oversaw the development of the organisation from a single building in the city centre to the multi-campus foundation it is today.

I began my career at St. Gabriel's 20 years ago as a physiotherapist and worked as the Children's Disability Network Teams Manager before taking on this new role. The whole ethos of St. Gabriel's is to support children and their families to maximise the potential of children with additional complex needs. It is a very special place to work and I am encouraged by the great team of people working with me to navigate this landmark period in disability services.



With the Respite House officially opened last year, followed by the establishment of a second Children's Disability Network Team, based in Parnell Street, Limerick, and the development of an outreach clinic in Charleville, the services offered at St. Gabriel's continue to grow. The Respite House has funding for 5 out of 7 nights and we have been promised additional funding to open for 7 nights. Once that funding comes through, we will be able to offer more support to families.

We know how generous the local community have been and St. Gabriel's is very grateful for the state funding we receive but it's just not enough to support the level of care we want to provide. Donations from local community and corporate groups help to enhance the services. St. Gabriel's welcomes support from businesses and individuals in the local community. Every single donation makes a difference.

#### **OPENING OF THE RESPITE HOUSE**

In case you missed it, the official opening of St. Gabriel's Children's Respite House took place on 22nd October 2021 in Mungret, Co. Limerick by Minister of State for Disabilities, Anne Rabbitte, TD. It was a truly wonderful occasion to see something that was fundraised so hard for, eventually open. Thank you to everyone who supported this project.

The new regional overnight and short-term respite care service is offered as part of our existing range of high-quality services for children with disabilities and complex medical needs. The Respite House is funded for 5 out of 7 nights and we hope to secure additional funding to bring it to 7 nights this year. St. Gabriel's respite service is the first of its type in the region offering respite care outside of the family home.

Located at Mungret, the beautifully designed and purpose-built 6-bedroom children's respite house is fitted out to the highest standard with medical and with exceptionally complex conditions.

Many infants and children are diagnosed with long-term illnesses that impose serious limitations on their well-being and course of life. They are a very vulnerable group of children with the utmost medical and nursing needs, many of whom require 24-hour care. Consequently parents and families face many challenges, so when developing this new respite service our focus was to provide appropriate medical or nursing care for children with such complex needs.

Respite is considered central to quality of life. It can be an opportunity for families to do things that they wouldn't normally get to do like homework or watching a movie.

These short breaks are critical when it comes to maintaining the family unit and general well-being and are a life-line to families.

Our dedicated team at St Gabriel's Respite House create a loving and caring environment to ensure that each child's individual needs are met during their stay.
